



# Emissions Testing Means Cleaner Air!

## YOUR VEHICLE FAILED ITS RETEST What Should You Do Next?



### REPAIRS

You are encouraged to have further repairs completed and pass an additional paid inspection.

OR



### WAIVER

Apply for a one-time-only waiver from further repairs for this registration period.

To apply for a waiver, you must bring your vehicle, repair receipts, repair orders and supporting documents to the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality waiver facility (see locations on back). **No appointment required.** **Waiver hours are limited to 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.**

A vehicle is not eligible for a waiver unless all factory-installed emission control devices are connected and in operating condition. All appropriate repairs within the applicable repair cost limit (below) must be properly completed in order to qualify for a waiver.

If a waiver has been granted previously, the vehicle is not eligible to be granted another in this or future years.

### MAXIMUM REPAIR COSTS

Age of Vehicle	Phoenix	Tucson
1980 & Newer	\$450	\$300
1975 - 1979	\$300	\$200
1974 & Older	\$200	\$50
Heavy Duty Diesel	\$500	\$300

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### One Time Only Waivers

Vehicles may receive only one repair waiver in the lifetime of the vehicle, at a fee of \$15, which is valid for the current vehicle registration period. Waiver eligibility requires at least two test failures. Once a waiver has been granted, the vehicle is not eligible for another waiver failure in future years.

Failing vehicles which have already received a waiver must be repaired and pass inspection before renewing registration in metro Phoenix or Tucson. Vehicles which exceed two times the allowable emissions standard are not eligible for a waiver until the vehicle is repaired sufficiently to reduce emissions to less than twice the standard. Vehicles that fail due to failure of the catalytic converter are not eligible for a waiver. If your vehicle fails, it may be better to repair the vehicle to pass inspection, rather than to seek a waiver.

State law requires the seller of a vehicle that has received a waiver to tell any potential buyer that the vehicle is not eligible for a waiver in future years.

Emission related repairs made up to 60 days prior to the initial failure may be creditable toward a waiver.

---

### Extended Warranty Coverage

Many vehicles have specific warranty provisions for emissions-related repairs. Before making necessary repairs, consult your owner's manual, your dealer or the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency website at [epa.gov/otaq/customer/warr95fx.txt](http://epa.gov/otaq/customer/warr95fx.txt) for information on whether your vehicle has warranty coverage.
